Stringed Instrument Makers of Southern California

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

Article I NAME

This Association shall be known as: **Stringed Instrument Makers of Southern California**, hereinafter "SIMSCal".

Article II ORGANIZATION

SIMSCal shall be structured as a membership organization, in which members approve the direction of the Association, elect officers, approve By-Laws, and authorize expenditures for special purposes.

Article III STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The purposes for which SIMSCal is formed are -

- to promote association among stringed instrument makers (luthiers) in Southern California,
- to further the understanding of stringed instrument building, and to help improve the instrument-making skills of our members, and
- to bring to the public an increased understanding of and appreciation for the luthier's craft.

Article IV COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

It is the policy of SIMSCal to comply with all applicable laws and regulations.

Article V MEMBERSHIP

Any person interested in lutherie may become a member.

Article VI MEETINGS

Section 1 General Meetings

Meetings of the General Membership shall take place from time-to-time, but in no case less than quarterly.

Section 2 Annual Meeting

The first meeting the year shall be the Annual Meeting, at which Officers shall make their annual reports to the membership, and elections for that year shall take place.

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Article VII OFFICERS

Section 1 Officers

Office holders shall be elected from members in good standing. At minimum, officers of the Association shall include President, Secretary/Treasurer, and Director-At-Large.

Section 2 Duties

Officers shall perform the duties pertaining to their respective offices as described in the By-Laws, and other duties as may be approved by the General Membership.

Section 3 Term of Office

- The ordinary term of office shall be one year.
- The Treasurer's function shall be limited to nonconsecutive terms.

Article VIII EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Executive Board shall consist of the Officers of the Association.

Section 1 Duties

- Direct the activities and conduct the ordinary business of the Association in accordance with the Statement of Purpose.
- The Executive Board shall perform the duties described in the By-Laws, and other such duties as may be approved by the General Membership.

Article IX FINANCIAL MATTERS

Section 1 Basis of Operation

The Association shall operate on a cash basis entity, subject to federal and state regulation, with a fiscal year that runs from January 1 through December 31.

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Article X CHANGES TO THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

Section 1 Procedure

The following shall be followed for enacting, amending or repealing any portion of these Articles:

- The proposed amendment shall be submitted in writing, with sufficient time for consideration by the members, for approval by the General Membership;
- A favorable vote of the two-thirds of the membership shall be required to amend or repeal any of these Articles of Association.

Article XI DISSOLUTION

Section 1 Distribution of Assets

Distribution of assets at dissolution shall be to current and former members based on number of years as a percentage of total cumulative membership years.
